World Book Day – 5th March 2020

At Stepping Stones Nursery School, we are promoting 'World Book Day 2020' - not as a dressing up opportunity, but as a chance to highlight the real importance of sharing stories with your child.

We have joined Early Years Scotland's campaign 'Every Days a Story Day' and have pledged to ensure that all children will have a chance to listen to a story every day they attend our nursery setting.

As part of our ongoing commitment to the campaign and to promote children's enjoyment of books and stories, we have recently purchased a wide range of story books and props, including puppets, for each of our 3 nursery playrooms.

This usually lasts about 30 minutes. Further details to follow.



EXPLORER ZONE

'Sharing a book with a child is fun -it's a time for closeness, laughing and talking together. It can also give children a flying start in life.' (BookTrust)

It's never too early to share stories, books and rhymes with your little one. They don't need to understand all the words, they will just love to listen to your voice, look at the pictures and hold the books.

Board books are always good for pointing out the pictures and naming things you can see on the page. They're also more robust for little hands still learning to turn a page!

ADVENTURE ZONE

'Spending 10 minutes a day reading to your child helps them to develop social and emotional skills and become confident happy learners.' (BookTrust)

Use the pictures to engage your child's interest – ask questions such as: 'What can you see on this page?' 'Can you find the rabbit?' 'What else can you see?' 'How many bananas can you count?'

We have been reading lots of stories. Some of our favourites have been 'Shark in the Park' by Nick Sharatt, 'We're going on a bear hunt' by Michael Rosen and 'A squash and a squeeze' by Julia Donaldson.

DISCOVERY ZONE

'Reading to children at age 4-5 every day has a significant positive effect on their reading skills and cognitive skills (language and literacy, numeracy and cognition) later in life.' (Dept of Education, Melbourne)

Children use their knowledge of stories to inspire their play in all areas of our nursery. We have had '3 Little Pigs' building houses in the construction area, 'We're going on a bear hunt' outside, 'Jack and the Beanstalk' in our sensory garden, 'Gingerbread Man' in our small world area and 'The Runaway Pancake' in our kitchen. Great inspiration and lots of learning!
